

Sun Safety

Please take the time to read through the points below as it outlines some details about sun protection and how you can help. Unfortunately, our school site is positioned so that the playground is in full sun most of the day and, as it is a large tarmac area, it can become very hot during the summer term.

Cornwall has exceptionally high UV levels. We all need some sun exposure; it's our primary source of vitamin D, which helps us absorb calcium for stronger, healthier bones. Unprotected exposure to the sun's ultraviolet rays, however, can cause skin damage, eye damage, immune system suppression and even cancer.

The children have been told about the importance of 'sun safety' in assembly by Mr Terry and class teachers will continue to reinforce this message in all classes. The three ways in which you can most help us and your child is:



1. Help them to apply sun cream that protects for 10+ hours before school (at least factor 30).

2. Send a named sun hat to school (and a light long sleeve t-shirt if they burn easily). Pupils will be expected to wear sun hats at all times during outdoor activities.

3. Make sure your child's water bottle is topped up and in school everyday.

Many thanks for your cooperation in this matter. If you have any questions, or helpful suggestions as to how we can improve our sun care further, please call in/phone or speak to Mr. Terry about it.



Sun Care

At Windmill Hill Academy we want our pupils to enjoy the sun safely. We will work with staff, pupils and parents to achieve this through:



Education

+ All pupils will have at least one 'sun smart' lesson in the summer term, explaining sun care, as suggested by Cancer Research UK.

+ We will talk about being sun smart in an assembly in both key stages in the summer term.

★ We are aware at WHA that there is an increased risk from the sun today and that we can help children become 'sun safe' by teaching them at an early age how to protect themselves. We see this as part of their PSHCE/Citizenship Education.

+ Parents and carers will be sent a letter explaining what the school is doing about sun protection and how they can help in the summer term.

Science Enrichment Day

The whole school had a fantastic day on Tuesday 14th March carrying out different science experiments. The theme for the day was 'changes'. They Key Stage One classes were mixed up and organised into smaller groups. The children carried out many science experiments



and investigations including: creating rainbows, growing plants, magnets, spaghetti structures, changes in spring and colour mixing. The children enjoyed learning about the changes that take place in Science and worked well in their different groups. There was lots of predicting, asking ques-

tions, answering questions and summarising the changes that had took place. The older children did a great job of supporting Year F with their learning.

Year 2's Trust Event: Storytelling

On Friday 10th March, Year 2 and the other Year 2 classes from the Andaras Multi-Academy Trust (St Stephens Community Academy, St Catherine's, Werrington and North Petherwin) gathered here at Windmill Hill Academy to take part in a trust event. The theme was 'storytelling'. Activities included: programming a story on the computers, a book scavenger hunt, a 'story in a bag', chalk drawings of stories and storytelling through dance.

The pupils from all of the Academies had a super morning. They enjoyed all of the learning activities and also working with other pupils. They look forward to their next event in the summer term.









Key Stage 2 News

Whole School Science day

On Tuesday 14th of March Windmill Hill Academy had a whole morning of scientific research. The theme of the morning was CHANGE, and each class had a wonderful time creating experiments and trying them out. At the start of the day the key stages were mixed into groups of: A, B, C, D, E, and F. All went to different activities and after a while they would swap around so everyone had a turn. One of the activities was with Mrs Millard; the main experiment was to see how shadows could get bigger and smaller depending on



where the light is. The pupils created their own puppets in mixed pairs, one of the pairs would make an animal and the other would make a person, after that the pairs would go behind the screen and create their own puppet show while the light was moved backwards and forwards. Mrs Millard quotes: "Everyone seemed to enjoy the activity, they produced good puppets and proved that the closer you are to the light source the bigger the shadow becomes."

The next activity was with Miss Young, teaching the children how to make a circuit and how to power bulbs and motors. The children worked in pairs to 'light up a clown's nose and spin his bow-tie!' The children experimented to see what would happen if they powered two bulbs at the same time, how they could make the motor go slower or faster and if they could find out how to make the bulb go dimmer and brighter. Joe Gent quoted "I loved this activity because it was intriguing me a lot; it was my favourite activity."

After that was Mrs Jackson's group, finding out how salt affects the water with density. The pupils got into pairs and began their experiment. They had a jug of plain water, an egg and a jug of salt. The children began by putting the egg into the jug of water, the children saw it sink, after that, the children took the egg out and put a large portion of salt into the jug and put the egg back in. Pupils found out that, like the sea, the egg FLOATED because the salt changed the density of the water. The egg bobbed around the surface of the water. Adam Worsnip quoted: "It was a strange but exiting morning of experiments."

A much enjoyed experiment was next; it was Mr Banks' experiment to see how the carbon and water inside a marshmallow would expand when exposed to heat. The group of children gathered around the fire and explained the fire triangle and how to keep safe around a fire. Each child was handed a skewer and a marshmallow to cook



and see how the marshmallow changed on the outside. Owen Welch quotes "I liked that after cooking the marshmallows we got to eat them, they were very tasty!"

At the end of the day the whole school gathered into the main hall and discussed about their different activities. Additionally, the teachers awarded some children science certificates and stickers. All children and teachers were happy with the conclusion of the day. Thank you to all teachers who helped make it happen.
