






World Book Day

Just a reminder, as a letter has already been sent home, that we will be celebrating 'World Book Day on Thursday 3rd March. we encourage children and staff to come to school, dressed as a book character. Visit

We ask that children bring a donation of £1 on the day, towards Book Aid International, who send over half a million books each year to libraries in some of the poorest countries in the Africa. In addition to dressing up, the children will be taking part in many 'book' themed lessons. They are encouraged to bring in their favourite book and/or the one that they dressed up as a character from as they will have some time reading/sharing this book during the day.

You child should have also brought home a £1 book voucher that can used in many book shops.

School Gateway

Online payments through School Gateway can now be made for Year 5 and Year 6 residentials and also, if you want to purchase a school sweatshirt.

Payment only needs to be made if you wish to buy a sweatshirt for your child - this is not a compulsory payment request. 
