Hook and Outcome

To begin your child's interest in our 'Elmer' topic, we will be reading the story 'Elmer'. Beginning your child's interest in a topic is called a 'Hook'. The outcome of this topic is to help your child to understand what makes 'Elmer' special and in turn what makes them special. It will also help to develop your child's knowledge of colours and their knowledge of animals in the world.

Mathematics

Can you say the numbers I-10 in songs and rhymes? Can you count out 5+ elephants? Do you recognise the digits 0-5+? Do you know how to combine two groups of elephants (+)? Can you sort elephants into groups of size or colour? Can you tell me what one more or one less would be (+/-)? Can you recognise and describe simple shapes or patterns? Do you know your colours?

Personal, social and emotional development


Can we play with other children taking turns and talking to each other? Do you know the names of the other children in the class?

Can we work together to get something done? Can you plan what you would like to play? Do you know the names of the adults in our school? Can we be a good friend like Elmer?

Do you know the Elmer stories? Who is Elmer? Who are his friends? Why is he special? Can you recognise your own name? Can you re-tell a familiar story using a story telling method?



Foundation Stage Autumn Term 2019

Hello, this overview will give you some idea of what your child will be learning in our first topic of the autumn term which is 'Elmer'. You will receive an overview for each topic that we complete in class. It is designed to inform you and also help you to support your child at home.

One way you can really help us over the next few weeks is to help your child to recognise and write their own name, holding their pencil correctly with the correct pencil grip. We will also be practicing our counting regularly over the next few weeks. You might like to help by encouraging your child to count in practical activities. Examples could include counting steps, plates at dinner or cars when you are parked at the shops.

Reading is really important and we want our children to develop a love of reading and books. Please try and read with your child every night. This can be either their school book or a favourite book at home. We change reading books on a Manday, Wednesday and Friday providing there is a comment in their reading record.

Your child will receive a portion of fruit and water is readily available each day, so it is not necessary to send snacks to school.

We change for PE every Friday so your child will need their PE kit in school every week. These will be sent home every half term to be washed.

A change of clothes, trainers/wellingtons along with a waterproof coat are also needed for our 'Wild Tribe' sessions which will take place throughout the week. These clothes/wellingtons can stay in school. Many of you have already brought these items into school so thank you!

Homework is sent out on a Wednesday and is due in the following Monday each week. Your child will receive phonics sheets based on the sounds they have been learning during the week. It would be much appreciated if you could encourage your child to complete their homework on a weekly basis as this will help them to consolidate the learning they have completed in school.
