We hope you found the longer style consultations beneficial in giving you longer to discuss your child's learning and next steps. Last half term's learning connection block was, 'Rebellion and Invasion' and it was great to see and hear all of the learning that took place both at school and at home (their home learning looked wonderful!). The children enjoyed sharing their learning with each other in a celebration of learning assembly and with you at the parent drop ins - they really do enjoy sharing their learning with you. We hope you can make the next one (see diary dates section). The next learning connection block is, 'Natural Elements', which will run for approximately five weeks. As mentioned before, all year groups (Y1—6) will be focusing on the same learning connection block at the same point but focus on a different concept. You would have also received a copy of a knowledge organiser with the key facts related to the learning concept. The expectation is that pupils learn the information, both at school and at home, as they will be quizzed at various points during the learning concept. You may have noticed two new logos at the bottom of this newsletter. I am pleased to say that we achieved two learning marks. School Improvement: Attendance

Our school target for attendance is 97.3 % and, as you know, we have attendance rewards for both classes and individual pupils to encourage good attendance. If your child arrives after the 8.55am bell but before 9.15am, they will receive a late mark. If they arrive after 9.15am, they will be marked as an unauthorised absence for the morning session. Please notify us as soon as possible if your child is unwell and we can record this as an authorised absence. If we do not receive a reason (we will try to contact ALL contacts for your child), the absence will be unauthorised. Holiday will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances, so if this is the case, please email or write to the Head of School (Mrs Abby Bassett). We are happy to give medication, e.g. Calpol if your child has a cold but is well enough to come to school, in line with our 'Managing Medicines in School' policy. Please bring medication to reception and complete a form. Please try and keep medical/dental appointments outside school hours. Where this is not feasible, please take your child out of school for as little time as possible. The reason we try to achieve good attendance is not about the school target – it is for your child's future. We work closely with the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) to monitor termly attendance and she will contact families where attendance is a persistent problem. Please remember, if you have any problems getting your child to school regularly – come and talk to us, we are happy to help.

Quality time with Mary and Misty, our Pet Therapy Nationwide volunteer and dog



We have all thoroughly enjoyed meeting Mary and Misty, our Pet Therapy Nationwide volunteer and dog. All of the children (consent permitting) have just about met them. If not, they will get a chance to meet them this half term. Once they have all had a chance to meet them, the children will have the opportunity to read to Misty.

How does a dog help children to read?

Dogs give unconditional acceptance, as they are non-judgmental, which is especially crucial to

struggling, emerging readers. The dogs also provide confidence to children as they do not make fun of them when they read, but above all they make amazing listeners, providing the children with a sense of comfort and love. Research has proved that students who read to dogs show an increase in reading levels, word recognition, a higher desire to read and write, and an increase in intra and interpersonal skills among the children they mix with.



Why have a school dog?



Children can benefit educationally and emotionally, increase their understanding of responsibility and develop empathy and nurturing skills through contact with a dog. In addition to these benefits, children take great enjoyment from interaction with a dog and having a dog in school can encourage reluctant children to come to school. Misty is gentle and loving, and offers children opportunities to improve their social development skills, unconditional acceptance and the chance to do something really well. For some children, a dog will be a special friend, helping them to build self-esteem, relax and have fun. For others, time spent with a dog will be a reward for

excellent effort with a difficult challenge.


Windmill Breakfast Club

If so, you must now apply for a school place for him/her for September 2020. If you have a child born between the above dates, you must submit an online application (www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions). If you do not have internet access, please call in at the school office for further information. A formal application through Cornwall Council must be made by parents for all places for children due to start school in September 2020. The deadline for applications is **15th January 2020.**

If you, or your know any prospective parents would like to have a tour of our wonderful school, please let them know that my next date is **Thursday 28th November at 9.30am.** I will do another one in December, if required.

Year 6 parents should have received a communication regarding transfer to secondary school and details of the application process and submitted their application online (www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions), as the deadline is today (31st October). If you haven't, please contact them directly as it is in your child's best interest that you do not delay doing this.
