

# Key Stage 1 News

#### Year 1 and 2's Trip to Eden

Year 1 and 2 had a fantastic time at the Eden Project on Tuesday 6th March. This visit linked brilliantly to their learning at school, as their project was 'Green Fingers'. The pupils took part in a workshop called 'Green Machines' where the pupils went on a sensory journey to find out how clever plants are. They were introduced to parts of the plants and their uses, using props, movement and picture. They then went to gather plant facts and examples around Eden during a hands-on discovery walk through the Mediterranean and Rainforest Biomes. This visit gave the pupils opportunities to embed and develop their learning, particularly in Science. Pupils were commended by the Eden staff on their learning and their good behaviour. Finally, a special thank you to all of the parents who volunteered and assisted us in making this day a success.



Year 2's Pizza Making workshop

Year 2 took part in a 'Pizza Making ' workshop on Wednesday 7th March. This was led by Warburtons and was linked to their current learning in Design and Technology. During the morning, pupils learned about healthy eating (including the eatwell guide and its key healthy eating messages), health and hygiene and then a hands-on food activity where the pupils learned about basic food skills and got to make a pizza with their favourite, healthy toppings. We hoped they enjoyed eating them at home and that you got to have a taste! Our



visitors were very generous, as pupils also got to take home a pack of giant crumpets and toastie pockets. Again, pupils were commended by our visitors on their fantastic learning and behaviour. Well done Year 2!
