#### Year 5 Fire Station Trip

On the 14th February Windmill Hill Academy, Year 5 went to the Fire Station to be taught how to stay safe in different places.

The staff at Launceston fire station taught us how to keep safe when different occasions come around. Other schools did attend



this trip and joined in with all the same activities. The workers were telling

us how to keep safe on the beach, in a car and at a train station. (Did you know that a tissue box travelling at 30mph is the same as a brick!) We also learned about fire and electrical safety and to stay away from dangers such as power stations. #### Lego Workshop

To extend and enrich their science learning about electricity, Year 4 and Year 6, took part in an exciting lego-themed workshop where they were challenged to build and light up their own lego cities. They worked collaboratively in house teams to design and construct their buildings and create settlements – they even created an underground rail network where they used switches to control the trains running on the tracks. Eve-



ryone had great fun learning how to create battery powered circuits and then enjoyed exploring how to add in switches so they could turn the lights on and off. Pupils also experimented with cre-

#### **Maths Challenge**

On the last day of term, KS2 took part in a Maths challenge morning. Each class split up into three different groups for each teacher's activity. Year 5 did not take part, as they went on a on a trip to the fire station.

Miss Osborne's activity was in the ICT Suite playing a maths investigation game with frogs and toads. KS2 Maths challenge 'round robin'. They used problem solving to master tasks involving strategic planning and problem solving.

Using ICT and the challenge 'Frogs and Toads', pupils tested their strategic thinking by swapping the sides of the frogs and toads in as few jumps as possible. Miss Young was in the Year 6 classroom doing multiple maths games on boards and sheets of paper.

We had a fantastic maths lesson and hope to do it again.

On Friday the 10th February KS2 mixed classes to share a number of maths challenges. They used problem solving to master tasks involving strategic planning and problem solving.
