## Parking

Please can we remind everyone to park considerately at all times. If you bring children to breakfast club, please leave your car in a parking space and take them to the door. We have had recent reports of inappropriate parking in the Penworth Close area. Please do not block our neighbours in or out and please do not park anywhere which may block the vision of or obstruct other road users. Parking on site (other than for bringing children to breakfast club) or collecting from an after school club) is strictly for staff and people with school parking permits. These permits are for Blue Badge holders or anyone who has a letter from a recognised medical professional stating they have a medical condition. Please respect these rules at all times to help us keep a safe site.

Parking permits are available for The Cattle Market or The Leisure Centre. Please call at the office to receive one. These are free.

## Do you have a child who was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2013 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2014?

If so, you must now apply for a school place for him/her for September 2018. If you have a child born between the above dates, you must submit an online application (<u>www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions</u>). If you do not have internet access, please call in at the school office for further information. A formal application through Cornwall Council must be made by parents for all places for children due to start school in September 2018. The deadline for applications is 15th January 2018.

### Year 6 – secondary transfer

All Year 6 parents should have received a communication regarding transfer to secondary school and details of the application process. If any Year 6 parents have not received this, please let us know. It is very important that you now deal with the application for your child and it is in your child's best interest that you do not delay doing this. If anyone does not have internet access or has any queries about the process, please contact the office. The deadline for applications is 31st October 2017.

#### Key Stage One Diary Dates Autumn Term 2017

Dear Parents/Carers,

We endeavour to keep parents informed so please do take the time to read and take note of the following dates for this term. In addition, during the course of the year, you will receive updates in the form of letters, newsletters (subscribe on the website), social media sites (Twitter and Facebook) and text messages but also please take a look at our website. <u>As a reminder, children in Year F are part of our Key Stage One. It will be indicated when classes are doing separate events.</u>

Monday 11<sup>th</sup> September to Monday 16<sup>th</sup> October 2017 Year 1 Swimming for this half term Children must have a swimming kit (labelled with their name) in school for these sessions.

Friday 15<sup>th</sup> September to Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2017 Year 2 Wild Tribe Children will be taking part in Wild Tribe sessions (previously called Forest Schools) in our school grounds and/or Windmill Woods on a Friday afternoon. These sessions will be taking place regardless of the weather so we ask that children have wellies/old trainers and a set of old clothes. Please label these items with their name, including their bag. The school provides a waterproof coat and trousers.


