# Payment Diversion Fraud

The purpose of this alert is to provide knowledge and prevention advice to schools and parents of students in order to prevent them from falling victim to payment diversion fraud – a fraud that involves falsely creating or diverting payments.

#### **ALERT CONTENT**

Payment Diversion Fraud Fraudsters are placing themselves in the middle of transactions between parents and private schools. The fraudster contacts the parents outlining details and payment instructions for the latest school fees. Initial contact appears to primarily be made via email and often from the school's own compromised email system. However the NFIB has also seen instances where the email address used is similar to that of the school (i.e. nn instead of an m). The victim then makes the required payment into the bank account which is in the control of the fraudster. By the time the fraud has been identified, the funds have already been dissipated. In several instances there has been a strong social engineering element at play within the email, with the fraudster suggesting a discount on the fees can be obtained if the parents pay early.

#### **PROTECTION / PREVENTION ADVICE**

Parents Always verify email payment changes in respect of payment fees with the school directly using established contact details you have on file, especially for ones which are not expected or for a different amount than expected. Always review requests to changes for payment requests. Check for inconsistencies or grammatical errors, such as a misspelt school name or a slightly different email address. Don't be afraid to verify details when being asked to make fee payments into a new bank account.



# **Key Stage 1 News**

#### **Evidence of a dinosaur in Year 2!**

The Year 2s had a shock when they came into their classroom on Tuesday 8th January to find they couldn't enter it as 'no entry' tape was covering the door, an alarm was sounding and there were tables and chairs knocked over! When Mrs Bassett had checked it was safe, the pupils were allowed to enter. Upon entering, they soon realised that there was evidence that a dinosaur had been in the classroom. This included dinosaur footprints and there was even a nest with an egg inside. The pupils soon turned into detectives and went on a mission to work out what had happened, to predict what type of dinosaur they thought had entered the classroom and what type of dinosaur was in the egg. Many thought it was a Tyrannosaurus Rex in the egg but when it hatched, which was the following morning, they found out it was actually a Duckbill Dinosaur. They soon realised that the day's events all linked to their focus story, 'Tyrannosaurus Drip'.

"I enjoyed being the Scarecrow but I was also scared going on stage!" Thomas.


"I thought that it was fun, and a great experience." Hester (Tin-man).


