Hello again and welcome to our October newsletter. I would like to start by saying a HUGE WELL DONE to the Friends of Windmill Hill and the pupils, parents and families who supported our entry in the Launceston Carnival. We were awarded second place in the walking group, as well as winning the Youth Council 'Best Children's Entry'. The Youth Council awarded us a lovely big cup to show off in the school reception as a result. Thank you once again to everybody who came along and supported us.

I mentioned before the summer holiday about Visible learning (VL) being introduced in school. It is a resource that is being implemented across all the ADMAT schools. I wrote about the Learning Pit as a place where our pupils (and the staff) can often find

themselves when faced with challenges and new learning. We have now started to adopt a common language of learning. We have initially introduced eight words that relate to our learning at Windmill Hill: brave, connect, resilience, reflect, curiosity, question, tenacity and self-aware. These will be known as our 'learning sails' and I hope that the pupils will be able to talk to you about their meanings as we move through the school year.

I hope you all have a pleasant half term and we will see you again on Monday 30th October.

## **Key Stage 1 News**

#### Wild Tribe activities in Year F and 2

Year F and 2 have been taking part in lots of Wild Tribe activities at the moment as part of their outdoor learning. Year F have spent time in the school garden, also as a part of their Wild Tribe sessions. We have engaged in a range of outdoor activities, starting with a hunt for dinosaur eggs and building dinosaur nests. More recently we have been looking at changes in the garden in autumn. We have sorted leaves into colour and size groups, used magnifying glasses to search for bugs, threaded leaves onto sticks to make patterns and created homes for hibernating hedgehogs. Year F and the staff have enjoyed these activities so far and look forward to more time learning in the outdoor environment.

Year 2 have spent some of their sessions in the school garden but have also been up to Windmill Woods. Activities have leaned to a range of curriculum areas and their current project. These have included: making a home for a toy model which had to be strong and waterproof, making their names out of natural materials they could find and maths challenges, e.g. how many triangles can you make using 9 sticks? The children (and staff and parent volunteers) have thoroughly enjoyed taking part in these activities.









#### Year 1 and 2 Dogs Trust Visit

On Tuesday 3rd October, both Year 1 and 2 were lucky enough to be visited by Katie from the Dog's Trust who not only taught the children how to look after dogs as pets but also explained



the importance of staying safe around dogs, especially those they don't know. The children enjoyed acting out role

-play scenarios and were given lots of opportunities to discuss what they should do in different situations. We would like to thank Katie for coming in to help us learn how to stay safe.

#### **Launceston Twinning**

Launceston is twinned with a small town in Brittany – Plestin-les-Grèves – which is about the same distance from Roscoff as Launceston is from Plymouth.

The Twinning Association organises trips every other year to Plestin and on the alternate year our Breton friends visit us. We arrange exchanges with families of similar age if possible and, as we travel and socialise in groups, there is always someone around who can help out if there is a problem with the language. You don't have to speak French – just a willingness to travel to Brittany and experience the French culture close at hand and welcome a French family into your home.

Owing to the growing popularity of the twinning on both sides of the Channel we are looking for new families to join. Our Breton friends will be arriving in Launceston next April 28th, late on the Saturday evening, and leaving on



Tuesday morning 1st May – there will be an organised trip on the Monday. 
