

Farm to Fork

As part of their Autumn topic, Year F took part in a Farm to Fork morning at Tesco. They had a fantastic time making their own bread rolls and finding out how bread is made in store by visiting the bakery. They explored the fish counter and learnt the names of some of the fish (and held some too!). Year F also tried some





different cheeses and fruits and talked about the ones they liked. They had a great morning and Miss Jones would like to thank the parents who volunteered and also send a big thank you to Shelley at Tesco for organising the morning.

An Anglo Saxon came to our school! Class 4 and 5 are learning about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. To add some adventure to their work they were visited by an Anglo Saxon who worked with both classes. Some of the children wrote about their experience of the day..... We were listening to special stories which are called sagas. One was about Thor who had a magic hammer which he used to kill the giants. But ... the giants stole the hammer so they were doomed. The only way to get it back was for one of the goddesses to marry the leader of the giants. He chose Freya but she refused. So Thor pretended to marry the leader instead! (Jasmine) The funniest part was when Thor got to dress up as a pretty girl in a wedding dress to marry an ugly giant. But in the middle of the ceremony he stood up and said: "I am Thor!" When he ripped off his veil, out popped his beard! (Olivia)

My favourite story was about Grendel who had skin of iron and nobody but one man, called Beowulf, could defeat him. Later on in the day, Dave (the story-teller) came back and told us the weapons they would use. After that we got to be Saxons! (Lara)

Before that, we had a chat about how they would use all the weapons and armour. We also discussed how metal swords were expensive but spears were cheaper because they were mostly made of wood and they only had a little bit of metal. Farmers wouldn't have had enough money to buy swords so they would have used slings and stones instead. (Matthew C) He showed us shields, armour, swords, spears, arrowheads and axes. axes. Everyone dressed up and I got a shield, an axe and a helmet. We learnt what it was like to be in a Saxon war. (James)




