School Census


In January we have to submit the next school census and we have been informed that we need to record each child's country of birth and nationality.

Judy shared with the pupils how she writes her books and explained the techniques she uses to illustrate them, which she does herself too. The class listened intently to her first book 'The Ballad of Morgowr' and discussed the phrases and language she used – some of which is also written in Cornish.

As a result of Judy's visit, the children were inspired to plan and write their own stories, which they are keen to share with pupils in other classes.







