

Thursday 2nd February 2017 Year 1 and 2 Project Homework hand in

Thursday 9th February 2017 Year 1 and 2 'Challenges' Enrichment Day

We are using 2Build a Profile to make learning observations of the children in Key Stage One (including Year F). The really great thing about this system is that we have the ability to e-mail a selection of observations to you at the end of each half term. This system also gives you the opportunity to e-mail photos and observations to us at school. So if you see your child using what they have learnt in school at home, or if there is a wow moment you would like to share, simply take a photo, type a little bit about what they were doing and simply reply to this email. In order for this to be set up, we will need to have an up to date email address—please ensure you have informed the School Office of this. Daya told us about two main Gods, one of them had an elephant head called Ganesh.


After that we learned the Hindu alphabet and what it is. It was very hard to say as we needed to roll our tongue to say some of the words.
