I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all children and parents, including our new families, to the new academic year at Windmill Hill Academy. It now seems like the summer holidays are a distant memory but I hope you all had a restful break and are looking forward to the new school year ahead. We are very proud of how well the children have returned to school after the summer break and are already displaying their learning sails. The children have transitioned well into their new classes and are enjoying the new learning challenges.



Before the new academic year, curriculum leaders and teachers spent a lot of time refining our long-term curriculum map to reflect the emphasis on the wider curriculum. All year groups (Year 1 to 6) will continue to focus on the same learning connection block at the same point but focus on a different concept. The aim of this is to widen the children's curriculum knowledge and skills but to also build on the pupils' learning year upon year. For this half term, the learning connection block is called, 'Rebellion and Invasion'. Some classes are focusing on local history, the Romans or World War Two. Copies of the curriculum documents feature on the school website and the relevant ones shared via ClassDojo. The parent overview gives you a flavour of the learning taking place during the concept; the knowledge organiser which includes key facts the children need to know; and a homework menu for the children to carry out at home. Over the next few pages, look out for some of the excellent learning that the children have completed already.

Finally, I think it is safe to say that Bertie has settled into school life here at Windmill Hill Academy brilliantly! Not only has he made friends with the pupils, but also with the staff and parents too! 

Year 3


An Incredible start to Year 3's (Key Stage 2) Journey!

Year 4

In Music, we have started to learn violins and cellos with Mrs Gilbert. This will be taking place every Thursday until Christmas.









In Science, we have been focusing on creating simple circuits. After creating simple circuits, the children moved on to exploring the differences between conductors and insulators. The children realised that some materials were conductors, and some weren't.









Year 5

The school's learning connection block this half term is 'Rebellion and Invasion'. Following on from their study of Romans in Year Four, Year Five are studying the Anglo Saxons and Vikings. This week, we have learnt how and why the Vikings came to power and started to research Viking long-boats for our DT project. Look out for the final products.

Some of the children have started to produce some great home learning and look forward to seeing what each person has done during sharing time.





In science, we have been learning how Isaac Newton discovered the law of gravity and measuring mass and weight.

We were lucky with the weather managed to develop out invasion games skills through netball. Some of us still find footwork difficult, but we are all improving defending and marking.



Year 6



We have been enjoying our text called 'The Barrow Quest' which is about a young boy who was given the task of saving his tribe by trying to find the local magician. He had to be brave, conquer his fears and make lots of difficult



decisions.

After reading two chapters we went out into the garden and enjoyed acting out one of the main scenes before having to go back to class and begin writing our own version of a quest story.







We also wanted you to see this wonderful painting; painted in oils by Barnaby at home. He got his inspiration from watching 'The Joy of Painting' by Bob Ross on TV. It is an amazing painting showing depth and shadow and it evoked much conversation in class. Well done Barnaby!

Attendance Figures for September 2021

Our annual attendance target is **97%+**. Our whole school attendance figure last year was: **96.4%**. This is an increase from previous years but let's all work together to achieve 97% or higher this year.

We understand in some circumstances absence cannot be avoided, e.g. sickness, diarrhoea, Covid-19 symptoms. However, if it is just a cold or similar they are okay to be in school. Please note that holidays cannot be authorised during school term time so please bear this in mind when planning ahead. By not being in school, it has a significant effect on their learning, as well as their social skills, building relationships, self-esteem etc.

It is also important that children are not late to school. Remember all year groups will start at 8.50am from September and finish at 3.15pm.

We closely monitor our attendance and have to inform the Education Welfare Officer if individuals fall below 95%.

The class with the highest attendance each week, receives an extra playtime and the attendance trophy.

Each term each child can earn a different colour attendance badge. And, for each term within the year, they can earn themselves an additional bronze, silver or gold badge.
