Year F competed as teams in different races. They all did very well and cheered their team mates on. Mr Horn was very impressed with their physical ability. Well done Year F!

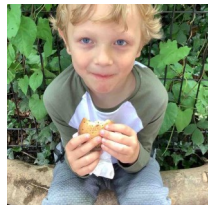


### Wild Tribe Enrichment Morning

Wow, what a year it has been! Year 2 have made us extremely proud. We will miss them next year!

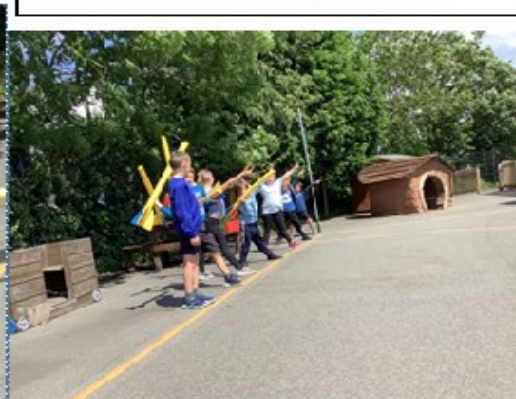
# Sports Day

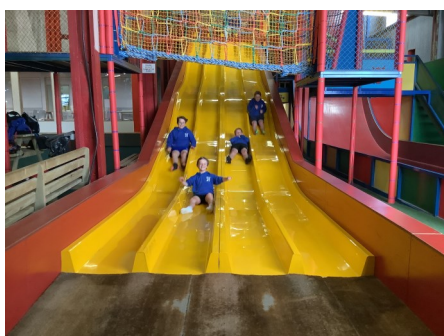


## Year 6

## Attendance Figures for July 2021

Our annual attendance target is **97%+**. Our whole school attendance figure is: **96.4%**. This is an increase from previous years but let's all work together to achieve 97% or higher next year.

We understand in some circumstances this cannot be avoided, e.g. sickness, diarrhoea, Covid-19 symptoms. However, if it is just a cold or similar they are okay to be in school. Please note that holidays cannot be authorised during school term time so

please bear this in mind when planning ahead. By not being in school, it has a significant effect on their learning, as well as their social skills, building relationships, self-esteem etc.

It is also important that children are not late to school. Remember all year groups will start at 8.50am from September and finish at 3.15pm.

We closely monitor our attendance and have to inform the Education Welfare Officer if individuals fall below 95%.

The class with the highest attendance each week, receives an extra playtime and the attendance trophy.

Each term each child can earn a different colour attendance badge. And, for each term within the year, they can earn themselves an additional bronze, silver or gold badge. These have been awarded today and there was a very high number.

### Parking

You are welcome to use our drop and go system in the mornings from September but there is strictly NO parking in our school car park apart from if you have asked for a permit due to having a disability. However, you all are able to apply for a parking permit to park in one of the local car parks for a short stay. Please enquire with Mrs Zoffman in September for more information.





## School Uniform

Our school has a very practical but smart uniform. It follows a colour scheme of royal blue and grey/black and consists of:

- A white shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- A royal blue sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan
- Black or grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- Blue and white gingham dress (Summer months)
- Flat black shoes

It is essential that children have a change of clothing for PE.

This should be:

- Black or grey shorts
- White t-shirt (not vest or crop top)
- White/black socks
- Black or grey joggers or leggings
- Additional school jumper or a fleece (recommended for the colder months)
- Plimsolls or flexible soled trainers (strongly recommended for wet weather)



Uniform can be purchased from Price and Buckland at <https://price-buckland.co.uk/> Now is the perfect time to get prepared for the new academic year. **Please note the last ordering date is the 1st August in order to secure uniform for September.** When you visit the website, select the school finder tab from the menu and view the range.

You will notice that you can now buy cardigans, aswell as jumpers. There is also the option to buy addition items, such as PE shorts/t-shirts. Please note there is no requirement to purchase the t-shirts/shorts/fleece advertised on the website, but there is the option to should you wish. Please note, the fleece is not to be used in place of a school jumper/cardigan and is only to be used as an extra layer in the winter months or for PE. Similarly, that the hoodie is only to be used for PE.

It is essential that all items of clothing are CLEARLY named.

Please remember that we have our uniform donation station which is well stocked and lots of nearly new and new items on there. Please pop into the main office if you would like any. In addition, we are running low on school jumpers so if you have any ones that you can donate, please drop them in.

The wearing of jewellery and makeup is not appropriate. Children who have their ears pierced may wear small studs or rings.

## Friends of WHA Welcome Leaflet

Welcome to Windmill Hill Academy! The Friends are a group of individuals (both staff and parents) who are interested in planning events for the pupils to enjoy. The money raised at these events goes towards purchasing much-needed resources and other items to enrich the school day. We are an integral part of the school community and have already raised thousands of pounds which has been spent on improving equipment and resources to enhance the children's' education and the facilities in school in general. We are about much more than just fundraising. Existing to provide closer links between home and school; it is an excellent way to bring staff, parents and children together socially in support of the school. It is fun too – as we are sure you will find out if you join us at one of the varied events throughout the school year.



**How do we raise money?** Like most PTAs, the majority of funds is raised through the events that we run. Some of our most popular events are the Christmas Fair, Easter Egg Bingo, Sponsored Bounce, Wine and Wisdom and Summer Fair. Donations from parents – of time, money, items for sale, raffle prizes or services and skills – are what determine the success of our fundraising activities. Even small donations make a big difference to us. We are always on the lookout for other good fundraising ideas too.

**The committee and our meetings.** Any parent is welcome at our meetings and we are particularly keen to meet new parents. Meeting dates are advertised via Class Dojo. They usually take place in the school grounds at 3.30pm. Our Annual General Meeting is held in the autumn term and this is an opportunity to come along and hear in more depth about events we run, funds raised and how the money is to be spent or has been spent. We also elect our new committee at this meeting.

**Community Links.** We have developed strong links with the local community and are always well supported by both residents and businesses. Many of our local shops, leisure facilities, community groups and restaurants are very generous in their donations of raffle prizes and funds and provide invaluable support, particularly at our fairs. We are extremely grateful to these community members as they make a huge difference to our fundraising efforts. If you think your workplace could offer us time, services or raffle items please do let us know.

**How do we spend the money we have raised?** Decisions on what items are to be purchased from the Friends funds are made during committee meetings. Requests can come from parents, staff or children. Normally, all the items the Friends approve for purchase are the extras that are not covered by school budgets. We always endeavour to spend our funds in ways that will benefit all our children across all areas of the school and curriculum.

**How can you get involved?** There are lots of ways you can help and support your child through the Friends. Offering to help before an event is so valuable, it doesn't matter if you can't help on a regular basis. There are always little jobs that can be done from home if you have half an hour to spare e.g. wrapping gifts, preparing raffle tickets etc. We really could not achieve what we do without the unseen army of help that exists in school. You can, of course, if you feel able, volunteer to be a Committee Member, or you can simply come along to the meetings and give us your ideas for fundraising events – this is also the time to ask questions or voice your opinion.
