Price is still £2.30 per child per session (which includes breakfast if required).

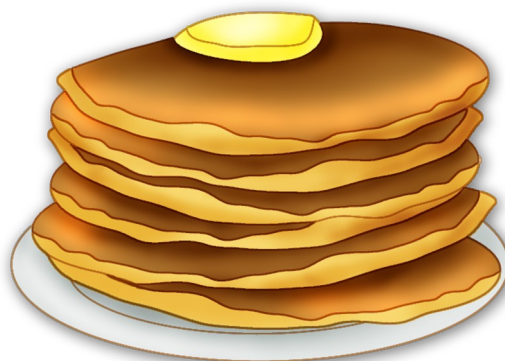

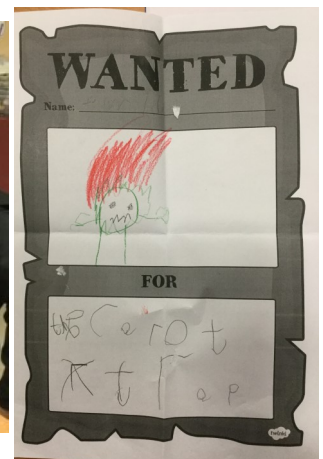


## Oh No! There's an evil sprout on the loose!

On the 24<sup>th</sup> January 2019, Year 3, from Windmill Hill Academy went on their adventure trip to Wheal Martyn, St Austell. This visit was part of their Topic title: 'Movement and Motions,' where the children have been learning about the local area and mining. The children have also been learning about rocks and soils in the local area through their Topic 'Extreme Earth.' Making a visit helps to keep learning real and in context for children.

Children curiously listened about Cornwall's history and solved the mystery of Victorian Clay. They also explored the woodlands, went on adventure trail and walked through the flat rod tunnel.
