

Music:

Can you recognise instruments played in a jazz?
Can you learn to sing or play along to jazz?

Can you perform at the Christmas performance?

At home: practice singing the performance songs and dances.

French: All About Ourselves

- *Can you name your facial features??
- *Can you extend a sentence using a conjunction and adjective?
- *Can you ask and answer questions about everyday actions in the classroom?
- *Can you say how you are feeling?

At home: Practise speaking French. Look for any words in the English dictionary that sounds French.

English: Journalistic writing

Can you tell the difference between formal and informal speech?

Do you know how to begin a paragraph with a topic sentence?

Can you tell the difference between direct and indirect speech - can you punctuate it correctly?

Short Stories

Can you vary sentence length for suspense?

Can you use bracket, commas and dashes for parenthesis

Persuasive Writing

Can you use modal verbs?

Can you use emotive language?

At home:

Read different short stories and select your favourite.

Look and listen out for any topical issues. When did you hear it? What is it about? Are there any that you feel strongly about?

Art: Textiles

*Can you create a weaving inspired by Van Gogh.

*Can you consider how to use recycled materials to landscapes?

At Home: research Van Gogh - what sort of art did he create? Do you like his work? Why?

Computing - We are artists

Can you use Turtle and Vector graphics to explore geometric art?

At home: look at geometric art - is there any that particularly interests you? How might it influence the computer art you create in school. You could keep a record in your journal.

Maths: Place value Mathematics

- Can you use mental addition and subtraction methods?
- Can you use written formal methods for addition and subtraction?
- Do you understand decimal number?
- Can you use mental methods for multiplication and division.

At Home: Practise any of the above using different representations (counters / pasta/ dried pulses, place value columns and illustrations).

Practise your x tables. Go to Times Table Rock Stars

Geography: Enough for Everyone / Carbon footprint

Can you investigate the following?

- *Can you list the resources a settlement needs to thrive?
 - *Can you list methods of power generation in the UK?
 - *Can you name some of the renewable methods of power in the UK?
 - *Can you explain why foods are imported and exported?
 - *Can you think of ways to reduce wastage, including water, electricity and general waste?
 - *Do you know where your food comes from? Do you know its carbon footprint?
 - *Can you explain how little changes can lead to big impact?
 - *Can you name areas of the world most affected by food shortages?
- At Home - discuss where the food you eat come from. Keep a journal to share in class.*

RE: Hinduism:

- *Can you explain how Hindus express their faith and what it tells us about their values?
- *Can you identify similarities and differences with other religions that you have studied?

At home: talk about what has been learnt in class and compare it to your own. Are there any similarities? Differences?

PE: Dance / Boxcercise

Can you perform a Bollywood style dance? (Christmas performance)

Can design a boxercise routine?

At home: research Bollywood dance.

What sort of moves does it have?

Can you create your own routine to your favourite song?
