It is clear that they have been demonstrating the different Visible Learning Sails and making good progress.

School Improvement: Visible Leaning

Miss Jones, Miss Callow and I, as well as other members of the team from our Trust had the pleasure of presenting at the CAPH (Cornwall Association of Primary Heads) Conference today. We talked about the positive impact we have had so far during our Visible Learning Journey. It was wonderful to showcase and celebrate the pupils' successes today.

Year F

As part of their story telling, Year F have been learning the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. They received a letter from The Hen asking for help to make some bread! The children learnt all about instructions and what we use them for. They were able to sequence the recipe and work together to make some bread!













The children then transferred what they knew about instructions to help them sequence and follow instructions for making a scarecrow. Why not come and see him in the Year F outdoor area?









Year 1

In Year 1, we have been using a wide range of resources to support and extend our maths learning. We have practised comparing and ordering numbers and learning how to record our addition calculations, as number sentences using mathematical symbols. We have also been focusing on developing our teamwork, problem-solving and communication skills in both our indoor and outdoor learning.



Year 2

As part of their art and learning connection block, Year 2 have been learning the use of collage. We have linked this to the Spanish Armada by creating silhouette ships! The children learnt all about using different sizes pieces and how it would impact our final piece. We also looked at the most effective way to glue our tissue paper to our creations!













Year 2 have also been working hard to develop their spelling skills this half term. We have been using rainbow spellings to help us identify the graphemes within words and it is great fun. Why not try and do this at home?







Year 3



During the month of October, Year 3 have continued to learn survival skills during their much-loved **Wild-Tribe** sessions: drilling; hammering; sawing; constructing; designing; shaping natural materials. In class, Year 3 have engaged in weekly **scientific investigations**, exploring the influence of friction on objects and the power of different types of magnets. Year 3 have enjoyed learning to play the **violin** and have all proved themselves very resilient in the process. Year 3 have been **reading** a variety of text (fiction and nonfiction) and have been using their recently learnt **writing skills** to create informative leaflets, diary entries and narrative poems.









Year 4





In PE, Year 4 have been focusing on Netball this half term.

We have worked on our passing skills. We can now complete overhead passes, chest passes and bounce passes.

We have also been able to work on the footwork needed to play netball correctly.

In Science, Year 4 have been focusing on the topic of electricity.

We were able to create an experiment to test whether equipment in the classroom are conductors or insulators.

We have also been able to discuss the importance of the power of a battery in making a light bulb work.





Year 5





As part of this half term's learning connection block, Year 5's Design and Technology learning has linked to this with the focus on making structures in the form of Viking ships. The process has involved researching, planning, making prototypes, making the Viking ships and then evaluating their effectiveness.

The children have displayed a range of the learning sails including curiosity, resilience and tenacity and connect.







Year 6



Year 6 have enjoyed their intensive swimming course this half term. They were at the pool every afternoon for two weeks and they all made very good progress, although they were exhausted by the end! Well done Y6!

Everyone thoroughly enjoyed doing the World War Two history topic this half term. They have learned about The Blitz, what it was like to live with blackouts every night and how to protect themselves during the war. They also learned about how their parents had to learn to live with ration books and how to try to make the food go around the whole family and how to 'make do and mend' with their clothes. The children found out about evacuees and thought about what it would be like to have a label around their neck and leave their parents behind at the railway station and go off with a small suitcase to live with a family they did not know in a safer part of the country. They all wrote a letter home to their parents.









In English, the children have been looking at non-chronological reports – The Yellow Spotted Lizard – taken from the book we have been studying – 'Holes'. They all produced an information poster warning against the dangers of the Yellow Spotted Lizard.

Attendance Figures for October 2021

Our annual attendance target is **97%**+. Our whole school attendance figure last year was: **96.4%**. This is an increase from previous years but let's all work together to achieve 97% or higher this year.

We understand in some circumstances absence cannot be avoided, e.g. sickness, diarrhoea, Covid-19 symptoms. However, if it is just a cold or similar they are okay to be in school. Please note, that holidays cannot be authorised during school term time so please bear this in mind when planning ahead. By not being in school, it has a significant effect on their learning, as well as their social skills, building relationships, self-esteem etc.

It is also important that children are not late to school. Remember all year groups will start at 8.50am and finish at 3.15pm. We closely monitor our attendance and have to inform the Education Welfare Officer if individuals fall below 95%.

The class with the highest attendance each week, receives an extra playtime and the attendance trophy.

Each term each child can earn a different colour attendance badge. And, for each term within the year, they can earn themselves an additional bronze, silver or gold badge.
