**21. Please comment on how the school could be improved:**

There seems to have been a reduction in enrichment trips which is disappointing.  
 The transition this year from Year 2 to Year 3 could be improved.  
 It is great that school gets involved in sports tournaments/competitions, but it would be great if the children could practice these sports and games in advance. Examples are netball and cross country. If the children have time/coaching to prepare, performing to the best of their ability will no doubt increase confidence.  
 Sometimes reaching the office can be a little difficult.  
 Monitor some of the language and topics discussed by some parent groups in the playground at drop off.  
 Better, clearer website.  
 We miss parents coming to school for reading to your child mornings, decorations day etc.

Dojo points seem to be inconsistent.  
 Additional funding for further one to one support for children with high needs.  
 Some of the content/views in the library books are a little outdated.  
 Lunchtime arrangements: Year f ok but children could be easily missed when in other years.  
 More government funding which is currently in short supply.  
 If there was more funding, then there would be more equipment and tools which would benefit the teachers and the children.  
 A drama/theatre group for all age groups would be great.  
 More notice of trips and asking for help on trips earlier so we can help.  
 The only thing I could suggest is for a post box system for Children to be able to write a note and share their worries, concerns and questions. An ideas/worry postbox allows children to anonymously off load their problems, and ideas.  
 Push more of doing homework.  
 More updates on topics learnt that day so we can link to things at home much easier if needed.  
 I feel like the jump from Year 2 to 3 is huge and there isn't enough preparation for the change.  
 Reading books aren't always changed regularly.  
 More selection on trips. I know cost is the main issue there for many.

Some of you mentioned staff availability after school. While meetings and clubs can limit this, we encourage you to contact the office or your child's teacher to arrange a convenient time. Our SENCO, Mrs Walsh, is also available for support, and Miss Armstrong continues to be a valued point of contact for many families.

We are proud of the range of enrichment opportunities we've offered this year—from trips and residential to community events and themed days. However, rising costs, particularly for transport, remain a challenge. We're grateful to those who contribute voluntarily and kindly ask for continued support to help us maintain these valuable experiences, including swimming.

Our after-school club provision has grown, and we are pleased so many children are enjoying the variety on offer. We will continue to explore new opportunities for the next academic year and welcome any suggestions you may have.
