







	Abby Bassett (Head of School) is the owner of Bertie and has full responsibility. Abby will nominate another staff member to be responsible where necessary. If the Head of School is not in school on a particular day, Bertie will remain at home. The site manager ensures that the site is secure and that precautions are in place to limit the chance of the dog getting loose. The dog is kept on a lead when it is not in its housing or in a secure location, e.g. in the head of school's office. The Head of School ensures that all appropriate doors are closed when the dog is participating in an activity, e.g. in a school hall. The site manager ensures that the premises is secure, e.g. fences are not broken. The dog has a collar with tag (contact details for home and school) and has an Apple Tag if he needed to be tracked/located.

The dog is permitted to go in the Head of School's Office and Main office, which is kept clean and secure for the wellbeing of the animal, pupils, staff and visitors. The dog is given no opportunity to come into contact with wild rodents on or off the school premises.

	The handler immediately washes their hands with sufficient soap and water after picking up faeces.		
	Any soiled dog bedding is immediately disposed of in sealed clinical waste bags and placed into a clin	d into a clinical waste bin.	
	The handler takes the dog's bedding home regularly to wash it.		
	Any pupils, staff and visitors who touch the dog are advised to wash their hands afterwards, and sufficient hand washing facilities are provided throughout the school.		
	Anyone with an exposed wound who touches the dog has the wound suitably covered.		
If the dog is ill with an infection or a disease, it does not return to the school until it has recovered.

	The dog is trained and is used to coming into close contact with people. The dog is provided with a place it can go to get away from people (his base in the Head of School's office). Pupils, staff and visitors around the dog are closely supervised by the handler. Bertie will be slowly introduced to people and will have time to get used to his new surroundings. Pupils, staff and visitors are advised not to put their face close to the dog. The dog is prohibited from roaming freely around the school without the supervision of the handler. Pupils, staff and visitors are to ask to stoke Bertie. The dog is being trained to not pull on the lead or jump up at people.
