#### What happens when I get to school?

Your grown-up will bring you to the front door, where you will line up with the other children from your class. Your teacher will be waiting for you.

#### What will I do in school?

"Let's ask if Evie and Aidan want a cup of tea," says Harry.




#### What happens when I need to go to the toilet?

The toilets are in the cloakroom and they are easy to find. You can go any time during play and when you are moving around the classroom. During carpet time, just raise your hand to let your teacher know.

"May I go to the toilet?" he asks.






Aidan is going to the toilet. You will go to the toilet by yourself, so your grown-ups will make sure that you have lots of practice before you start school. If you have an accident or need help, tell your teacher and they will help. Your grown-ups will leave some spare clothes in school in case you need them.

"Everything is just the right size for me!" Aidan says. "It is so easy going to the toilet by myself."



Aidan has been to the toilet and remembered to flush. Now he is washing his hands carefully with soap and warm water.





### What happens if I am hungry or thirsty?

You will always wash your hands before you have anything to eat as this helps stop germs spreading.

In the morning, you will have a snack. You can choose one piece of fruit and one milk carton or have a drink of water.


## What happens at the end of the school day?

At the end of the school day, you will sit on the carpet to listen to a story.


"What do you think will happen next?" the teacher asks.
