We are quickly approaching the Summer holidays and it is a good time to begin reflecting back on what we all have achieved this year despite the challenges of Covid-19.

We have been really impressed with the way the children have adapted this year and their ongoing resilience and natural curiosity towards learning. They have been completing assessments over the last few weeks to support their end of year teacher assessments and we have been really impressed with the progress that the children have made.

You will be able to see for yourselves when you receive your child's report which you will receive next week on Friday 9th July. This will be via our online ITrack system. Please follow the instructions for accessing which have been and will be posted on ClassDojo.



We have been restricted by the Covid guidelines in some ways this term for our usual events but, as usual, Windmill Hill Academy does not let this beat us! All it means it is that they have been slightly differently organised and we are sorry that parents are unable to attend these events. We will let Year 6 parents know about their child's Leavers' assembly nearer the time. Please see the diary dates section and keep checking ClassDojo for regular updates on these such as individual class sports mornings/activities and class enrichments.

Transition for Years F to 5 will take place for a whole week during the week beginning the 12th July. These gives the children the chance to get used to their new classroom environment and their class staff teams. We find that this really supports the children and allows the staff to really get to know the children before they start in September.

Covid-19 restrictions are certainly in place until the 19th July. We will keep you updated on these in relation to the latest Government guidance but until then we need to continue to follow the procedures in school. It is really important we do so to support the easing of the restrictions and hopefully have some form of normality in the summer holidays.

Year 1 and 2 outdoor area

I am pleased to announce that we have been successful in securing a Tesco Community grant for £1000 in order to further develop the Year 1 and 2 outdoor area. The teachers are busy planning the resources that they would like to purchase to support the children's learning and the continuous provision approach. The continuous provision approach is something that we hope to fully embed within Year 1 next year and develop in Year 2. We look forward to the resources arriving and being able to further develop the area in the Autumn term. It takes the staff a huge amount of time to set up the provision so we politely ask that the children are not left unsupervised in this area and that they do not play with the items before and after school.

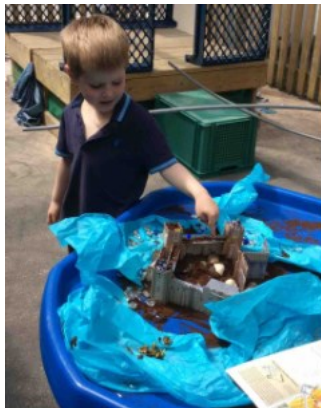

Well done Year F!



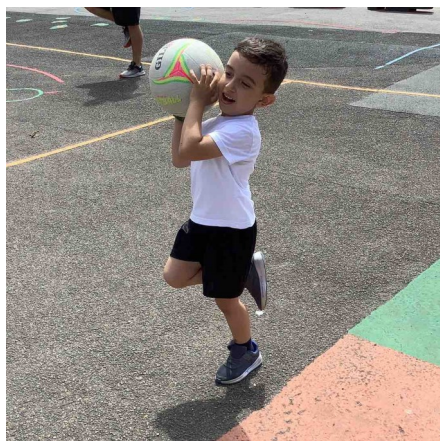
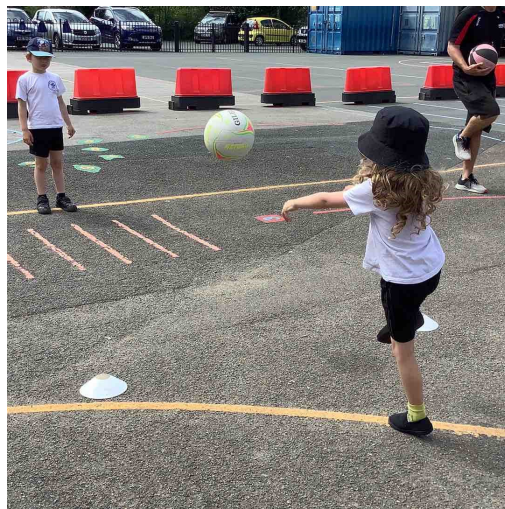
Enrichment Day

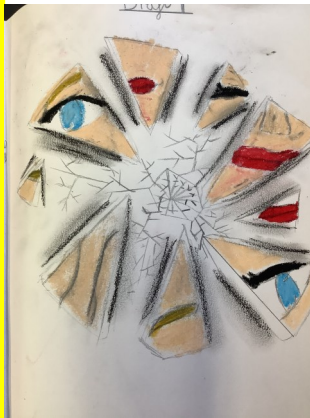
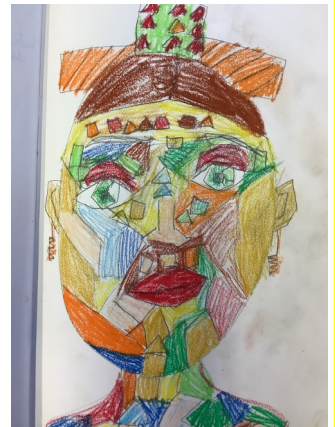
Year 5

Attendance Figures for June 2021

Our annual attendance target is **97%+**. We have been doing so well with our attendance this year but it is a shame to see that it has decreased since half term.

We understand in some circumstances this cannot be avoided, e.g. sickness, diarrhoea, Covid-19 symptoms. However, if it is just a cold or similar they are okay to be in school. By not being in school, it has a significant effect on their learning, as well as their social skills, building relationships, self-esteem etc.

School Uniform

Our school has a very practical but smart uniform. It follows a colour scheme of royal blue and grey/black and consists of:

- A white shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- A royal blue sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan
- Black or grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- Blue and white gingham dress (Summer months)
- Flat black shoes

It is essential that children have a change of clothing for PE.

This should be:

- Black or grey shorts
- White t-shirt (not vest or crop top)
- White/black socks
- Black or grey joggers or leggings
- Additional school jumper or a fleece (recommended for the colder months)
- Plimsolls or flexible soled trainers (strongly recommended for wet weather)



Uniform can be purchased from Price and Buckland at <https://price-buckland.co.uk/> Now is the perfect time to get prepared for the new academic year. **Please note the last ordering date is the 1st August in order to secure uniform for September.** When you visit the website, select the school finder tab from the menu and view the range.

You will notice that you can now buy cardigans, aswell as jumpers. There is also the option to buy addition items, such as PE shorts/t-shirts. Please note there is no requirement to purchase the t-shirts/shorts/fleece advertised on the website, but there is the option to should you wish. Please note, the fleece is not to be used in place of a school jumper/cardigan and is only to be used as an extra layer in the winter months or for PE. Similarly, that the hoodie is only to be used for PE.

It is essential that all items of clothing are CLEARLY named.

Please remember that we have our uniform donation station which is well stocked and lots of nearly new items on there. Please contact us if you would like any items. In addition, we are running low on school jumpers so if you have any ones that you can donate, please drop them in.

The wearing of jewellery and makeup is not appropriate. Children who have their ears pierced may wear small studs or rings.

Welcome to Windmill Hill Academy! The Friends are a group of individuals (both staff and parents) who are interested in planning events for the pupils to enjoy. The money raised at these events goes towards purchasing much-needed resources and other items to enrich the school day. We are an integral part of the school community and have already raised thousands of pounds which has been spent on improving equipment and resources to enhance the children's' education and the facilities in school in general. We are about much more than just fundraising. Existing to provide closer links between home and school; it is an excellent way to bring staff, parents and children together socially in support of the school. How do we raise money? Like most PTAs, the majority of funds is raised through the events that we run. How do we spend the money we have raised? Decisions on what items are to be purchased from the Friends funds are made during committee meetings. Requests can come from parents, staff or children. Normally, all the items the Friends approve for purchase are the extras that are not covered by school budgets. We always endeavour to spend our funds in ways that will benefit all our children across all areas of the school and curriculum.

How can you get involved? There are lots of ways you can help and support your child through the Friends. Offering to help before an event is so valuable, it doesn't matter if you can't help on a regular basis. There are always little jobs that can be done from home if you have half an hour to spare e.g. wrapping gifts, preparing raffle tickets etc. We really could not achieve what we do without the unseen army of help that exists in school. You can, of course, if you feel able, volunteer to be a Committee Member, or you can simply come along to the meetings and give us your ideas for fundraising events – this is also the time to ask questions or voice your opinion.
