

5000 BC: Farms growing wheat and barley and keeping cows and sheep now widespread.

4500 BC: First evidence of sailing ships.

3500 BC: First wall paintings and writing using hieroglyphic symbols.

3000 BC: First walled towns built.


2500 BC: Giant Sphinx and Great Pyramid of Giza constructed.

1550 BC: The Valley of the Kings now contains many royal tombs

1325 BC : Tutankhamun buried.

332 BC: Egypt invaded by Alexander the Great and becomes part of the Greek empire.




