We hope you all had a lovely Easter break and managed to get outside and enjoy some of the lovely sunshine.

We are hoping for continued sunshine over the next few months so please make sure children bring a sunhat to school and wear sunscreen.

The children have definitely been displaying the learning sail 'curiosity' when learning about their new learning connection block 'discoveries'. Have a look at some of their learning on the following pages.. Don't forget that copies of the curriculum documents feature on the school website. The parent overview gives you a flavour of the learning taking place during the concept; the knowledge organiser which includes key facts the

children need to know; and a homework menu for the children to carry out at home.

Today, your child(ren) will come home with a learning review slip. This includes your child's successes, next steps and attendance. If you require a follow up telephone appointment with your child's class teacher, you will need to phone the office to arrange one at a mutually convenient time.

We are really proud of how much progress the children are making and they certainly demonstrate lots of resilience during the challenges this year has brought with Covid-19. Please continue to support with reading, phonics and multiplication practice at home—it really helps to support their learning in school. If you need any support with this, please speak to your child's class teacher, and they will be happy to help with ideas.

Thank you for completing the Visible Learning surveys. I will be sharing more of an insight into our next steps over the next few months. Why not ask your child what the learning sails are and how they demonstrate these in class?

School Improvement: School site

You probably have noticed that we have had new fencing and gates installed. This was all finished over the Easter holidays. We were lucky enough to receive a grant to carry out these works. The fence borders the whole boundary of the school and makes every area a safe space. We urge you to use the garden or the steps as access in the mornings and afternoons but if you do need to use the front access please use the side gate for your safety.

I have also applied for further grants to continue to develop the school garden. We have already received funding from the Youth and Town council and have started to put this to good use. I am working with a few of the pupil parliament groups and they have planned the next projects and how to use the money to support these. The money will help to support the development of the whole area, including redevelopment of the pond area, nature area with natural habitats, more log seating etc. We will keep you posted on its redevelopment.

We are trying to be an 'Eco friendly' school so we don't send home newsletters. Black and white copies are available in the foyer. It will also be available on the website under 'Newsletters' in the 'Parents' tab and will be posted on ClassDojo.






















Year F have also continued with their weekly 'Wild Tribe' sessions.

Year 2


Year 2 have been very lucky and we started music this week with Mrs Gilbert this week!

During Science, we completed a sound survey around the school grounds. We walked to different places in the school and listened for any sounds.


Year 5








Year 6

School Uniform


Our school has a very practical but smart uniform. It follows a colour scheme of royal blue and grey/black and consists of:

- A white shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- A royal blue sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan
- Black or grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- Blue and white gingham dress (Summer months)
- Flat black shoes

It is essential that children have a change of clothing for PE.

This should be:

- Black or grey shorts
- White t-shirt (not vest or crop top)
- White/black socks
- Black or grey joggers or leggings
- Additional school jumper or a fleece (recommended for the colder months)
- Plimsolls or flexible soled trainers (strongly recommended for wet weather)



Uniform can be purchased from Price and Buckland at https://price-buckland.co.uk/
Select the school finder tab from the menu and view the range. You will notice that you can now buy cardigans, aswell as jumpers. There is also the option to buy addition items, such as PE shorts/t-shirts. Please note there is no requirement to purchase the t-shirts/shorts/fleece advertised on the website, but there is the option to should you wish. Please note, the fleece is not to be used in place of a school jumper/cardigan and is only to be used as an extra layer in the winter months or for PE. Similarly, that the hoodie is only to be used for PE.

It is essential that all items of clothing are CLEARLY named.

Please remember that we have our uniform donation station which is well stocked and lots of nearly new items on there. Please contact us if you would like any items.

The wearing of jewellery and makeup is not appropriate. Children who have their ears pierced may wear small studs or rings.

SchoolMoneyAPP (Eduspot)

Thank you for your support with Edupot and booking school lunches—it really is speeding up the morning return so we can fit more learning in. We require ALL parents to use the APP to book and pay (if applicable) for school dinners or select if they are a packed lunch. This is to be done in advance by the end of the day on a Sunday prior to the week ahead. You can currently book right up until half term. If you have not pre-booked and paid (if applicable) a required school dinner, you will be contacted to provide a packed lunch for your child. If you are having any problems, please contact Mrs Zoffman.



Bag2School

It is the perfect time to have a good clear out at home and we welcome donations to our Bag 2 School collection. Please bring your donations into school (use own bags) on the morning of collection (19th May) and leave outside the main entrance. Items collected - men's, ladies' & children's clothing, paired shoes, handbags, belts & accessories. (No uniforms, workwear, pillows, duvets or pieces of fabric please). All funds raised will go to the Friends of WHA.

End of Day Arrangements

Thank you for returning your end of day arrangements forms. If you haven't, please can you return very soon. If you need a replacement, please see Mrs Zoffman in the office.

For safeguarding reasons, pupils will only be able to be picked up by those listed (unless notified by 2.30pm on the day by the parent). This also applies to those in Y4/5/6 walking home - they will only be able to walk home if permission has been given on the form.

Windmill Breakfast Club

Windmill Hill Academy has provision for before school opens in the form of a Breakfast Club. It has fully opened in line with the Covid-19 regulations for breakfast clubs.

If you are in need of childcare before the school day commences, why not book into the Breakfast Club where they can safely eat breakfast and play within their class bubbles between the hours of 8am and 9am. They will be supervised by two qualified staff, Mrs Williams and Mrs Rutherford, for the duration of their stay before being escorted to their classrooms at the appropriate times.



There is a small charge for attending the club: £3.00 per session which includes breakfast of cereals, toast, fruit and juice or milk. If you are in receipt of Child's Tax Credits you may be able to claim the childcare costs back when filling in your annual award. Receipts can be arranged for this (please speak to Mrs Williams). Also, children who are in receipt of free school dinners or PPG, the cost is £2 per session.

Booking onto the club can be done online through the EDUSPOT app www.eduspot.co.uk whereby you can book the days you require and pay for them too. It's so easy! You will have to set up your information with a current email address and mobile number.
